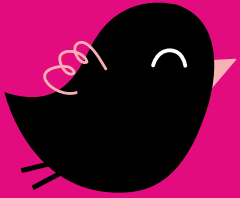

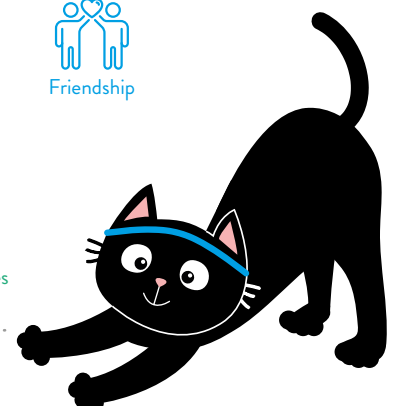

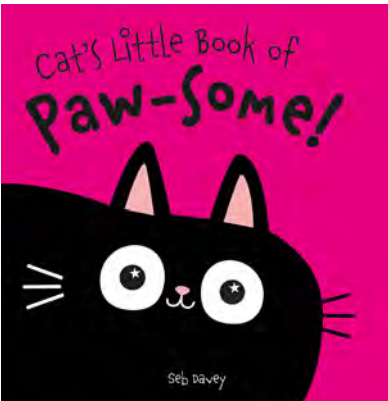




## Jawsome!
